





Seat Groups




For the High School Application, students are considered for offers in two seat groups:

Students with Disabilities (SWD)



Receive special education instructional programming for **more than 20%** of their academic program

General Education Students (GE)



Determined by most recent, finalized IEP | ** Not used for SHSAT or LGA admissions

Diversity in Admissions

- o A number of high schools have a Diversity in Admissions (DIA) initiative for Fall 2025 admissions.
 - o Some schools give an admissions priority to applicants who are low-income, English Language Learners (ELLs) or Emerging Multilingual Learners (EMLs), are in the child welfare system or live in temporary housing. A complete list of schools and their priorities is below.

- o You can find schools with DIA initiatives using the filters in our online high school directory (myschools.nyc).


DIA Eligibility and Chances of Receiving an Offer

○ **New this year!** When families log into the application and click Get Started, they will be asked to consent to their information being used to provide a personalized directory that will help families understand their chances of receiving an offer.

○ Answering yes to this question will also affect the student being correctly calculated for DIA priorities, otherwise they will not be considered for DIA seats.

○ NOTE: The directory will look different this year, and having a MySchools Account and being connected is the **best way** to view and consider programs to add to their application.



Random Number

In the family portal, once a family selects “Get Started” on the dashboard, answers the DIA consent question and then clicks on “Looks Good” at the bottom of the student profile page, the random number will be visible

Multiples Priority

What are **Multiples**? twins, triplets, etc applying to the same grade level

- ***There is no sibling priority in High School Admissions***
- Families with students that are participating in the same admissions process and have the same parent/guardian connected to their MySchools account may choose to submit identical applications for all students so they have the same random number*
 - Parent/guardian will only need to add choices to one application
 - Before submitting the application, they will be asked in MySchools if they want to add the same application choices to the other child's (or children's) application.
 - Students will be matched to the first random number that was generated.

Multiples Priority

*Based on the application submitted, students may not end up with the same offer. Characteristics that affect this possibility (based on admissions methods of programs on the application) are: if the students are not in the same seat group (GE vs SWD), have different Ed Opt categories, are in different screened admissions groups, or submit an assessment or audition and only one of them ranks high enough.

What To Do

1. Audition.

2. Learn How to Apply

- To apply to any audition programs (except LaGuardia High School programs), list them on your application.
- To apply to LaGuardia High School programs, submit a LaGuardia application. Do not list LaGuardia programs on your high school application.

3. Submit audition materials

- To apply to any audition programs (except LaGuardia High School programs), list them on your application. Be sure to check that you are eligible to apply to specific audition programs.
- To apply to LaGuardia High School programs, submit a LaGuardia application. Do not list LaGuardia programs on your high school application.

How Students are Considered for Offers

- High schools will score submitted audition materials.
- Students are then admitted in descending order of the audition score.
- **ONLY** LaGuardia High School considers a student's academic record.





How Students are Considered for Offers


- Based on academic records, students are assigned a category (high, middle, low)
- Offers are made to students in each category



Open and Zoned



Students are randomly selected based on preference order as indicated on students' submitted application




If there are more applicants than available seats, offers are made using students' pre-determined random number which can be found in Myschools.



For Zoned programs: Students are considered for offers based on where they live, if a student has a zoned high school, it will be listed in their Myschools profile


How To Apply

- List the program on your application
 - Make sure to review the eligibility criteria for the program before applying

How Students are Considered for Offers

- Applicants are considered for admissions based on the eligibility criteria of the program.
- Offers are made in priority group order (if applicable).

Screened Programs



How to Apply

- To apply to any screened programs, you simply need to add the program to your application.

How Students are Considered for Offers

- Students are considered for offers to programs in priority group order. Within priority group, screened programs consider students on academics.

How to Apply

- To apply, you simply need to add the program to your application
- Complete the program's required assessment. This could be an essay, or another school-created task.
 - Please note, some assessments may have deadlines that are different from the application.

How Students are Considered for Offers

- High schools will score their own assessments.
- A student's grades and their score for the assessment will be combined using a weighted average. Students are then admitted in descending order of the combined, weighted average.

New This Year: Offer Chances

MySchools now projects for each applicant if they have a low, medium, or high chance of getting an offer to high school programs.

MySchools uses the following information about each applicant and each high school program to show the predicted chances of getting an offer:

- A program's admissions priorities (for example, a borough priority)
- The number of seats at each program
- An applicant's screened admissions group and Ed. Opt. group
- An applicant's random number
- Whether an applicant counts towards general education (GE) seats or students with disabilities (SWD) seats

Offer Chances


When a high school applicant starts their application in MySchools they will be able to see their predicted chance of getting an offer in two places: the search page and the application builder.



A "high" icon showing three orange bars means that a student is expected to have a high chance of receiving an offer to this program. Students have a 99% chance of receiving an offer to a program that shows three bars.



A "medium" icon showing two orange bars means that the student is expected to have a medium chance of receiving an offer to this program. About half of students will receive an offer to a program that shows two bars.



A "low" icon showing just one orange bar means that the student is expected to have a low chance of receiving an offer to this program. Students have a 1% chance of receiving an offer to a program that shows one bar.

Offer Chances

There are some programs where there is not enough information for MySchools to show the chances of getting an offer.



- An icon with three dots will show for these programs
 - Audition:** students must submit an audition and are admitted based on their audition score.
 - Screened with Assessment:** students must complete an assessment, which determines admission.
 - Language Criteria:** programs consider students' English Proficiency and/or home language after the application closes.
 - Transfer (for over-aged and under-credited students):** students are ranked by the school based on a student's grades, age, or credit accumulation after the application closes.
 - ASD / ACES / D75 inclusion:** students must be deemed eligible to apply by



What are the Specialized High Schools (SHS)?

8 testing SHS – apply by taking the Specialized High Schools Admissions Test (SHSAT).

What is on the SHSAT?

- The SHSAT is a timed test: 180 minutes (no breaks)

For students with extended time accommodation: 360 minutes with two 15- minute breaks

- Two sections:
 - ELA section is 57 multiple choice questions.
 - Math section is 52 multiple choice questions and 5 “grid-in” questions.
- Two sample tests are in the ***Specialized High Schools Admissions Test (SHSAT) Practice Test for 2025 Admissions*** You can find more on the DOE website

Step 1: Registration and Timeline

- Registration opens on **October 1, 2024**

Registration deadline is **October 18, 2024**

- Families can register at **myschools.nyc**.
- During registration in MySchools, list the preference order for the
- up to 8 of the ***testing*** Specialized High Schools. Families/school staff will be able to indicate *and update this (by resubmitting) until the registration deadline*.

Registration and Accommodations

- Students who already receive testing accommodations on their assessments in school are entitled to testing accommodations on the SHSAT. This includes:
- Students with existing testing accommodations on their current IEP.
 - Students with an existing 504 Plan that includes testing accommodations.
 - Students who are English Language Learners (ELL), or eligible former English Language Learners.

Step 3: Registration and Accommodations





New this year! Additional Application Choices

- A complete high school application lists twelve high school programs. This year, if there are additional programs students are interested in, they may add them to their application as a thirteenth choice, fourteenth choice, and so on.
- There is no limit to how many programs students can list!
- Please note: students DO NOT need to add additional programs, this is only an option if helpful.

Preference Order of Programs

List programs in your **true order of preference**, starting with your top choice.

- High schools cannot see the order of programs on a student's application.
- Students are considered for offers in the order of the programs on their application.
- If you don't get into your first choice, then you are considered for the next choice.

It's as though the next choice is your new first choice.


